- Are a girl or are gender-expansive youth
- Identify as Asian American or Pacific Islander*
- Have 15 minutes to spare before **May 31, 2023**

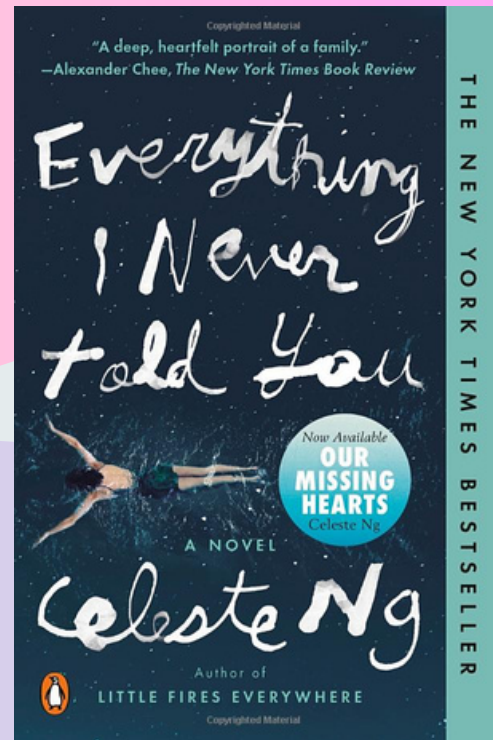
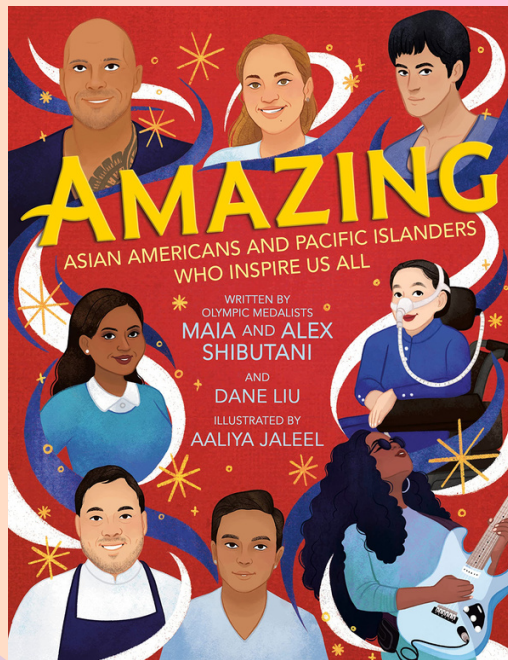
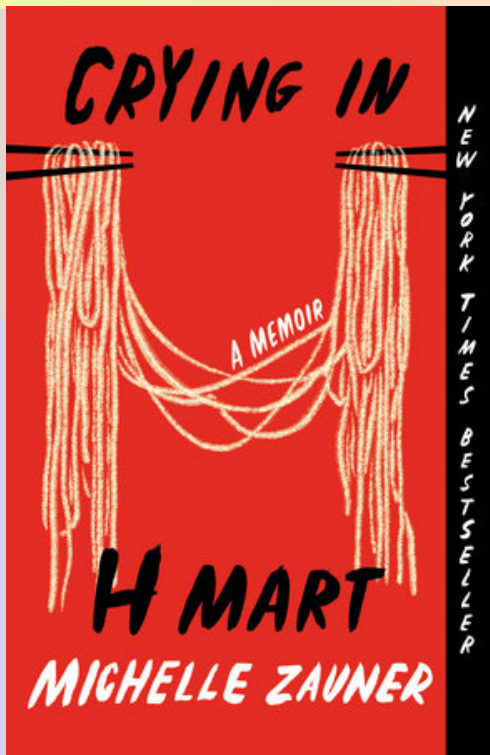
The results of this study will show us where we need to invest resources, time, and training to create more opportunities for AAPI girls' leadership success.
